

# LIVING INDEPENDENCE FOR THE ELDERLY (LIFE)

In 1998, Pennsylvania became one of the first states in the nation to offer the Living Independence For the Elderly (LIFE) program.

This program provides nursing-facility clinically eligible individuals age 55 and older a community-based alternative to nursing home care. This program offers: long-term services and supports (LTSS), acute care, behavioral health, pharmacy, meals, transportation, and any other services determined necessary to meet the individuals' needs.

### WHO IS ELIGIBILE?

Pennsylvanians age 55 or older who:

- Meet the clinical eligibility (level of care) needs for a skilled nursing facility or a special rehabilitation facility;
- Meet the financial requirements as determined by the local county assistance office or be able to private pay;
- Reside in an area served by a LIFE provider; and
- · Are able to be safely served in the community at the time of enrollment as determined by a LIFE provider.

### **LIFE HIGHLIGHTS:**

- LIFE is for people who want to continue living independently in the community, but whose health prevents them from doing so without special assistance.
- · Most individuals will have no charges, fees, premiums, co-pays, or deductibles.
- Takes care of medical, personalcare, in-home, and transportation needs.
- Features LIFE "day centers" for services, socializing, and more.

Individuals who are eligible for both Medicare and Medicaid can enroll for services through a LIFE Program at no out-of-pocket expense.
